I. What is the Title I Program?

Title I is the largest federal aid program for elementary, middle, and high schools. Through Title I, the Federal government gives money to school districts around the country based on the number of at-risk students in each district. The purpose of Title I is to ensure that all children have a fair and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education. Sarcoxie R-2 School District as a school wide Title 1 program which means that we serve all students and are continually working to improve the overall culture of the school.

Title I is based on three important ideas:

- Hire additional instructional staff
